Happy New Year church! I received a chortle from the staff on Tuesday when I mentioned that 'New Year' is just a social construct so it doesn't really exist! It is, nevertheless, a psychological helpful 'reset' – good riddance to the horrible bits of last year, thank you for the good bits, and here's hoping for more good bits in 2024. I only learned this week that it wasn't until 1752 that we actually celebrated New Year at this time of year! Until then it was March 25th, trying to sync up with the Spring equinox. That is why our tax year persists at that time -although it shifted to 6th April apparently because otherwise the government would have lost 11 tax days when the move from the Julian to the Gregorian calendar took place!

We were so thrilled to share our second Christmas with everyone at Churchdown. Driving down to my wife's farm in Salisbury on Christmas afternoon, I was filled with thankfulness at so many gospel opportunities throughout the month of December. December always presents a wonderful juxtaposition between the darkness of the year, with the light and hope that is offered in Jesus. Remember, don't write off asking your friend/neighbour/work colleague because of how you think they might respond. Just leave their response in God's hands, pray before you ask them and don't worry at all if they say no. I know someone who was asked 7 times over a period of years before he said yes and it changed his life forever! Here's to a great 2024 – in the Lord's strength and not ours.
