

## Vicar's Blog

This week we're continuing our 'Church of Tomorrow' series. We've looked at the fascinating image of the Choluteca bridge in Honduras in 1988 which, six months after being built, was hit by Hurricane Mitch. The good news was that the indestructible bridge stood firm. The bad news was that the course of the river had moved to the right of the bridge, rendering it totally useless! We reflected on the reality of church decline in the institutional church, like the Church of England, as it has failed to adapt missionally and into a post-Christian landscape. What once were helpful structures or scaffolds for discipleship, worship, and mission – e.g. "Come to church and get it all" – are now no longer the solution. We need a new, creative and missional courage to take the gospel to our culture.

We then reflected on the reality that in the church, it is so important to seek to make Jesus 'Lord' of every area of our lives, and not just 'Saviour'. We have to live out the paradox that on the one hand 'Jesus is Lord' and so we strive to make him that in our lives, but on the other hand 'Jesus is Lord' and so we don't strive because it starts with grace, and he is Lord and not us! In week three, we explored the theme of a church that is 'dependent on the Holy Spirit'. We need to not believe the lie that we somehow have an 'inferior Holy Spirit' to the apostles in Acts, or to the person beside you in church! The very same power that raised Christ from the dead is at work in us, but we need to ask him for that power, and exercise the gifts of the Spirit that he has made available to us.

This week we are going to be thinking about a church that has 'confidence in the gospel.' A legacy of our post-Christendom culture, where it was just a 'cultural thing', is that we've lost confidence in the gospel itself, and Jesus' ability to radically save and transform people's lives. For many of us, it's not just about capability or opportunity, it's about a mindset. Is it really real? Do I really believe it? Does every human on the planet need to know that Jesus is not just *my* Lord, but *the* Lord, and find salvation in him? Lord, give us confidence not in our own ability, but confidence in the gospel, the power for salvation for those who believe (Romans 1:16).
